



10 End of Life Questions to Ask Now Of yourself, spouse, parent &/or sibling.

I know these questions are tough to ask of yourself or a loved one, but there's really no good time to ask them. But they need to be known and ideally, when someone is in good health. Fill out this sheet, keep it in your safety deposit box and ensure someone knows where you keep the key.

- 1. Cremation? If so, where would you like your ashes spread, fully intact in one container or, most places offer the large urn and a little one for the fireplace?**

- 2. Burial? If so, where? Do you have a plot already purchased?**

- 3. Living will/personal directives. Is there one in place - if so where is it? What hospital do you deal with, family doctor?**

- 4. Organ donation. Does your family know these wishes?**

- 5. Power of attorney - is there any in place? Who would you like to make these decisions (financial and otherwise) in the event of incapacity?**

- 6. Will. Is there one? Where is it?**

- 7. Safety deposit box. Is there one, where is it, where are the keys? Does anyone know where the keys are kept?**

- 8. Special gifts. Do you have any that are essential to pass out? Where are your pictures - for final planning?**

- 9. Religion - would you like a minister, what kind, a certain denomination, prayer service, wake, non religious, other?**

- 10. Last rights, anointing, prayer - at a time of sickness, would you like someone called for prayer and if so, what type (denomination, minister, anyone?)**
